What Do We Do?

We offer:

Legal Services: We assist in the filing of important immigration papers, provide legal counseling and refer cases needing extensive legal assistance to pro-bono and low cost legal providers.

Employment Search: We offer seminars on job readiness, resume writing, and job search.

Family Support: We assist families in assessing needed social and community programs. We also help families identify and overcome possible stress points and crisis which arise as a result of reunification, and adjustment.
